## to Recognise Compliance with the OECD Principles of Good Laboratory Practice (GLP) under the OECD Guidance for GLP Monitoring Authorities

### between

# The Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in New Zealand

#### and

### The New Zealand Commerce and Industry Office

On 5 December 2014 in Taipei, Taiwan, the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in New Zealand and the New Zealand Commerce and Industry Office (the Participants) signed an Arrangement Regarding Accreditation Cooperation (the 2014 Arrangement). The Implementing Bodies to this Arrangement are the Taiwan Accreditation Foundation (TAF) and International Accreditation New Zealand (IANZ).

Paragraph 6, Section 4 of the 2014 Arrangement provides for the following:

Mutual Recognition of Good Laboratory Practice (GLP) Compliance Monitoring Undertake evaluations, against Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) criteria, of each body's GLP Compliance Monitoring programmes, in order to sign a Mutual Recognition Arrangement to enable regulators in each other's economies to accept data that meet OECD GLP requirements.

Following satisfactory evaluations of such GLP Compliance Monitoring programmes, the Participants mutually decide the following:

Test facilities conducting non-clinical safety studies of chemicals in Taiwan in accordance with the OECD Principles of Good Laboratory, and having been inspected and found to be in compliance with the OECD Principles of Good Laboratory Practice by TAF, will be recognised by IANZ in New Zealand as a GLP Compliant test facility and will recommend to New Zealand regulatory authorities the acceptance of the GLP compliance status of such studies, and;

Test facilities conducting non-clinical safety studies of chemicals in New Zealand in accordance with the OECD Principles of Good Laboratory, and having been inspected and found to be in compliance with the OECD Principles of Good Laboratory Practice by IANZ, will be recognised by TAF in Taiwan as a GLP Compliant test facility and will recommend to Taiwan regulatory authorities the acceptance of the GLP compliance status of such studies.

This Arrangement will come into effect on the date of the last signature. Paragraph 9 of the 2014 Arrangement regarding the terms of the duration and termination shall apply to this Arrangement.
